CALL TO ORDER

<u>RESOLUTION OF ADOPTION - DAVIDSON-RANDOLPH REGIONAL HAZARD</u> <u>MITIGATION PLAN – RESOLUTION NO. 03-21</u>

Mr. Alton Hanes, Coordinator with Davidson County Emergency Services, presented to Council a Resolution in Support of the Davidson-Randolph Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan.

Every five (5) years, Counties and Municipalities are required to review their Hazard Mitigation planning process with the assistance of a State-provided vendor/consultant. Davidson County is part of a regional plan with Randolph County under the guidance of North Carolina Emergency Management. Counties and local municipalities are required to adopt a resolution of plan support.

The Town of Midway is required to adopt regulations designed to promote the public health, safety, and general welfare of its citizenry. The Town may choose to participate with the County's plan or develop and adopt a plan of its own. Midway currently participates in the Davidson County Regional Plan.

Hazard Mitigation Plans are required by the State and FEMA to be eligible for certain types of grants following disasters.

Data is compiled indicating all types of storms/disasters that can affect an area and looks at all vulnerabilities that each community can face from those storms/disasters. Actions are added to help mitigate further storms/disasters to lessen the impact of disasters on the area. Adopting a resolution allows the Town to apply for public assistance if damages are incurred with future storms/disasters.

Town Staff participated with an extensive review process in 2019. Midway's updates/revisions were reviewed by local Emergency Management prior to submission of the entire plan for review by State agencies.

It is the recommendation of Staff to adopt Resolution No. 03-21 supporting and participating in the Davidson/Randolph County Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan.

RESOLUTION OF ADOPTION DAVIDSON-RANDOLPH REGIONAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN

WHEREAS, the citizens and property within the Town of Midway are subject to the effects of natural hazards that pose threats to lives and cause damage to property, and with the knowledge and experience that certain areas of the counties are particularly vulnerable to drought, extreme heat, hailstorm, hurricane and tropical storms, lightning, thunderstorm wind/high wind, tornado, winter storm and freeze, hazardous material incident, and wildfire; and

WHEREAS the Town desires to seek ways to mitigate the impact of identified hazard risks; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of North Carolina has in Part 6, Article 21 of Chapter 143; Parts 3, 5, and 8 of Article 19 of Chapter 160A; and Article 8 of Chapter 160A of the North Carolina General Statutes, delegated to local governmental units the responsibility to adopt regulations designed to promote the public health, safety, and general welfare of its citizenry; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of North Carolina has enacted General Statute Section 166A-19.41 (*State emergency assistance funds*) which provides that for a state of emergency declared to pursuant to G.S. 166A-19.20(a) after the deadline established by the Federal Emergency Management Agency pursuant to the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2002, P.L. 106-390, the eligible entity shall have a hazard mitigation plan approved pursuant to the Stafford Act; and

WHEREAS, Section 322 of the Federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 states that local governments must develop an All-Hazards Mitigation Plan in order to be eligible to receive future Hazard Mitigation Grant Program Funds and other disaster-related assistance funding and that said Plan must be updated and adopted within a five-year cycle; and

WHEREAS, Davidson County and Randolph County have performed a comprehensive review and evaluation of each section of the previously approved Hazard Mitigation Plans, has updated said plan as required under regulations at 44 CFR Part 201 and according to guidance issued by the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the North Carolina Division of Emergency Management, and has prepared and adopted the Davidson-Randolph Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Town Council of the Town of Midway to fulfill its obligation to develop and adopt an All-Hazards Mitigation Plan by adopting the Davidson-Randolph Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan in order that the Town will be eligible for federal and state assistance in the event that a state of disaster is declared for a hazard event affecting the Town;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Council of the Town of Midway hereby:

- 1. Adopts the Davidson-Randolph Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan (the "Hazard Mitigation Plan"); and
- 2. Vests Davidson County Emergency Management with the responsibility, authority, and the means to:

- (a) Inform all concerned parties of this action.
- (b) Cooperate with Federal, State and local agencies and private firms which undertake to study, survey, map and identify floodplain areas, and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to management of adjoining floodplain areas in order to prevent exacerbation of existing hazard impacts.
- 3. Appoints Davidson County Emergency Management to assure that the Hazard Mitigation Plan is reviewed annually and every five years as specified in the Plan to assure that the Plan is in compliance with all State and Federal regulations and that any needed revisions or amendments to the Plan are developed and presented to the Town Council for consideration.
- 4. Agrees to take such other official action as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the Hazard Mitigation Plan.

<u>APPROVE – AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO THE ENGINEERING SERVICES CONTRACT</u> <u>BETWEEN THE TOWN OF MIDWAY AND THE WOOTEN COMPANY DATED MARCH 22,</u> 2018 FOR TOWN PARK TRAIL - TWC PROJECT NO. 3080-F

On March 22, 2018, the Town entered into a contract with The Wooten Company to provide design for grading and permitting of the development for the Midway Town Park Trail.

Part of the process in getting the picnic shelter started, is meeting the grading, drainage, and soil erosion requirements mandated by the Department of Environmental and Natural Resources (DENR). Town Manager Tammy Michael, Town Clerk Linda Hunt, Marty Marion with Metropolis Architecture, and John Grey with The Wooten Company met to discuss those requirements. By providing an amendment to the current contract, The Wooten Company will provide final grading, drainage, and erosion control services that will allow the Town to proceed with the building specifications for the picnic shelter.

Town Attorney Jim Lanik has reviewed and approved the contract.

The following Amendment shall become a part of the Contract Agreement.

1. Scope of Civil/Site Work

- 1. Incorporate Town approved final site layout plan provided by plan (**BY OTHERS**)
- 2. Prepare Existing Conditions/Demolition Plan (**BY OTHERS**)

- Prepare Final Grading Plan & Drainage Plan TWC will coordinate with the Architect. Note, stormwater treatment is excluded.
- 4. Prepare Erosion Control Management Plan & associated calculations required for permit submittal to NCDEQ-Land Quality
- 5. Utilities Plan (water, sewer and electrical)- **BY OTHERS**
- 6. Final Planting Plan **BY OTHERS**
- 7. Architectural/MEP/Structural Plans **BY OTHERS**
- 8. Site Lighting Plan **BY OTHERS**
- 9. Prepare Detail sheet(s) for erosion control
- 10. Provide Technical Specifications for grading, drainage, and erosion control only-Template for specs provided by architect
- 11. Provide Preliminary Opinion of Probable Construction Cost for related civil items (grading, drainage, and erosion control) only
- 12. Limited Construction Observation Services for up to four (4) site visits during construction
- 13. Coordination with Design Team.

Additional Services

In addition to the foregoing services being performed, the following services may be provided upon amendment and prior written authorization of the Owner.

- 1. Redesigns ordered by the Owner after final plans have been accepted by the Owner.
- 2. Appearances before courts or boards on matters of litigation or hearings related to the project as well as town council presentations, public meetings, or public outreach.
- 3. Geotechnical Investigations (**Owner to provide copy of report**)
- 4. Traffic Impact Analysis (TIA) Studies.
- 5. Updated Topographic Survey- To be provided by Owner
- 6. Archaeological or Historical Survey
- 7. Construction Phases Services beyond those listed in Scope of Work above, including Bidding/award and construction administration services
- 2. The Wooten Company proposes to complete this work on a lump sum basis for \$17,650.00.
